

**Self -Help Agreement
Washington Sailing Marina**

In the interest of protecting the environment and providing a safe and healthy arena for our patrons and staff, several Best Management Practices relating to boat repair and maintenance have been implemented to insure the accomplishment of those goals:

- A filter cloth needs to be placed under any boat requiring service on land. The cloth needs to extend at least three feet beyond the bow and stern and the port and starboard side by at least three feet. The filter cloth must also be in place prior to power washing. The marina will provide a filter cloth upon request.
- Only minor work can be performed. This includes sanding/painting (top side, hull, and bottom), washing/waxing, minor fiberglass repair, wood/teak refinishing and minor blister repair. All work must be completed within 14 days from first day hauled.
- No vehicles are permitted in the boat yard at any time for any reason.
- All sanding must be done with a vacuum sander.
- All self help customers are required to wear a mask while sanding.
- No spray painting of any type is permitted.
- All work must be done in work yard.
- Engine work to include oil and lower unit grease replacement is not permitted while in travel lift straps.
- Chemical paint strippers and cloths may not be used at travel lift well.
- All tools, chemicals, cleaning materials, paint, etc. must be removed from the marina or stored inside the boat at the end of the work day. No paint or cleaning supplies can be left unattended.
- Left over paint and cleaning supplies must be disposed of at a facility away from the marina.
- No paint, fiberglass, solvents, cleaning supplies, sanding dust, paint chips, brushes, tools or batteries can be dumped into the river. All dumpings must be reported to the U.S. Coast Guard.
- Only Marina Staff are allowed to move and adjust boat stands.

Before beginning any work on a boat, the below signed individual agrees to the rules listed above. In addition, that individual agrees to insure that any assistants, helpers or crew also comply with the same rules. Violation of any of the above rules can result in termination of the self-help project.
